I hope you've been able to stay warm and dry as this winter weather settles in. Sticking with Daniel, we read:

But Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine ... Daniel 1:8

The powerful, Babylonian king has taken the finest and brightest young nobles (including Daniel & his friends) from Jerusalem to train them for his service. His plan is to integrate them into his culture and make them Babylonian – giving them new names and immersing them in the language and literature of Babylon.

Daniel and his three friends go along with everything. They answer to their new names, they thrive in their studies, and they surpass all the Babylonians at being Babylonian! God gives them wisdom and understanding because He's planned for them to have influence in the royal court. Daniel engaged with his new environment; and has the freedom to do so. In fact, he must do so. God's people are not to withdraw from where God has placed them, but to engage at every level – social, political, and educational. God expects His people to be culturally and socially involved – influencing through social media, serving in civic organisations or on school Governing Bodies, even playing sport at local clubs. God is Ruler of the world, and His people must bear witness to Him in every aspect of it, not least in caring for the vulnerable and serving those in need. We serve God *in* the world. But we are not *of* the world!

Daniel *resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine (1:8).* Having integrated in so many ways; why refuse the royal food and wine? Why not eat from the king's table? Although the text doesn't tell us explicitly, it's most likely political – to do with submission and allegiance (see Daniel 11). Eating from the king's table implied fellowship with him, expressing acceptance of his over-lordship and assumed loyalty to him. Daniel could not do that!

That was the line where involvement became assimilation; where interaction became allegiance; where he'd have stopped being an Israelite and become a Babylonian. This is the line where allegiance to God is compromised! In resolving not to partake of the royal food, Daniel displays faithful allegiance to God rather than to Nebuchadnezzar. God expects that same loyalty from His people today. He expects us to serve in the world and among the world, and that we will do so without compromise of His name. We too must resolve to honour God, rather than to please man. So, we will need to be counter-cultural on occasion; going against the flow, standing against the crowd, speaking against social wrongs as we remain faithful to God.

As we live in this world at this time, let us resolve not to compromise our character or conduct as we resolutely remain loyal to God; and may He give us the wisdom, courage and strength to do so.

LADIES Tea in Newlands

On **Saturday, 10 June**, the SCC ladies met together for a special tea in Newlands. The ladies enjoyed some delicious tea & cakes followed by a demonstration by Sarah Dunn on how to make a garlic & rosemary focaccia bread.

Jenny Inglesby did the talk, which was titled **"Women to Women - About Life & Godliness"**. She shared from the book of **Titus** how we, as women, ought to be grounded in Gods word, so that Godliness and self control would be displayed in every area of our lives. We learnt that, as women, our main sphere of influence and our God given calling is in our homes as wives to our husbands and moms to our children. We also learnt that it is



precisely this Godly living in our homes that we are to teach and model to younger (and older) women around us. She also shared some practical suggestions on how we can be more involved in each others lives so that ministering to women at SCC would not only happening at special ladies events, but that it would be taking place informally on a "One-2-1" basis with one another.
