

Pondering Esther's story on Sundays, made me think of Daniel's story:

... Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it.

And the Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand ...

Daniel 1:1-2 Israel faces a crisis of epic proportion! The powerful, Babylonian king, Nebuchadnezzar has surrounded Jerusalem, with the threat of destruction. In order to survive, Israel agrees to hand over their king, a number of their royals and young nobles (including Daniel), and much of the Temple treasure. It seems Nebuchadnezzar holds all the cards and Israel has lost them – humiliated and ridiculed as they face Babylon seemingly alone. No doubt, they were tempted to think God is not present or powerful – *otherwise how could this happen?* We might relate to such a temptation! As we face a crisis, endure sickness, cope with stress, or an economic struggle; maybe we also question God's presence and power, question His love and goodness – maybe, we too are tempted to feel abandoned?

So, it's important to notice 4 small words in v2 that anchor the chapter (and book): "and the Lord gave!" The writer wants us to know that when catastrophe struck Judah, it was God and not Nebuchadnezzar who is ultimately moving the wheel of history. God gave Israel to Babylon ... Babylon didn't take it. He drives this point home by repeating this phrase: God gave favour and compassion to a Babylonian official (v9) and God gave knowledge and understanding to Daniel and his friends so they could thrive and take up the place. He had determined for them in the Babylonian courts (v17). God gave!

We must realise that God is in control. Everything that happened is according to His plans. Israel may not have fully understood that at the time, but it doesn't change the fact — God is in control. "While on the level of human observation, Nebuchadnezzar's military prowess wins the day, the Bible takes us behind the scenes and shows us that God is in control — He is sovereign and directs the world ... both on the battlefield and in Daniel's classroom. God is in control to further His purposes in history!"

That is our comfort today – God is in control. He rules over all things – pandemics, injustices, hardships and, even, our sufferings – directing them in accordance with His good purposes. Even though we may not fully understand why certain things come to pass (whether on a global, regional or personal level), even though we may not like what's happening (especially at a personal level); we can be sure that God is in control – He has neither abandoned nor forsaken us but is working to accomplish His good purposes (see Ephesians 1). So we do not lose heart and we are not discouraged – God is with us and working for our good and His glory.
