#### Abraham's Tough Journey



Unfortunately, Abe (or Abraham, as we fondly named our new mission vehicle) was involved in an accident with a motorcycle while being transported through Tanzania.

This accident caused significant damage to the vehicle. However, the most important thing is that the injuries sustained by the men involved were not life-threatening.

On the same day a beautiful little girl was born to the Mulenga family whom we have been closely working with at Christ Church Lusaka. She has been named after Renee and that is a very precious gift from God to encourage her. # SPOTLIGHT on JAKE GRIESEL

### TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOUR FAMILY

I grew up in a happy Christian home first in Durban and then on a sheep farm in the rural southern Free State (albeit schooled in Bloemfontein), as the youngest of three children (two older sisters). I am blissfully married to Daleen, we met as classmates studying theology together at the University of the Free State.

# TELL US ABOUT YOUR CAREER AND WHERE YOU CURRENTLY WORK?

I spent the entire decade of my 20s studying theology, culminating with a



PhD in historical theology at the University of Cambridge in 2019. Directly thereafter Daleen and I returned to South Africa for me to take up a position at George Whitefield College (REACH-SA's theological college in Muizenberg), where I now serve as Lecturer in Church History and Anglican Studies. My main roles are teaching, postgraduate supervision, and research.

#### WHAT DO YOU DO IN YOUR SPARE TIME?

The outdoors (one of the things I enjoy most about living in Cape Town), read ing (mostly theology and history), watching sport (especially football). I've been an ardent Real Madrid fan since childhood, (rugby, and tennis), and keeping an eye on current affairs and geopolitics.

#### WHAT MINISTRY ARE YOU INVOLVED IN AT SCC?

I preach occasionally to fill in for Luke when needed (and as my work schedule allows), I'm on the roster for setup on Sundays, and currently attend the Thursday community group hosted by Andy and Sarah Dunn and led by Roald Besselaar.

# TELL US BRIEFLY HOW YOU BECAME A CHRISTIAN?

I grew up in a Christian home and had been exposed to the Gospel from childhood, but became rebellious and hardened against the faith in my teenage years. The Lord used a potentially fatal car accident in my first year at university (2008) to, as it were, slap me awake to the reality of my mortality and my desperate need of Christ, and for the first time in my life I believed not merely that Christ died and rose again in the abstract, but that he did so for me. The rubber hit the road in more than one sense: through that accident the Gospel seeds that had been sown into my life from early childhood germinated and permanently changed the trajectory of my life and my eternal estate.

# CAN YOU RECOMMEND A GOOD BOOK AND MOVIE?

There are loads of great books I could recommend, but to recommend something edifying and easily accessible, I would recommend two classics: the Heidelberg Catechism and Augustine's Confessions, both of which are freely available online. For a much more weighty read, John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion (also freely available online) has been one of the most influential books in my personal theological development.

#### WHAT IS YOUR FAVOURITE DISH?

I am favourably disposed to anyone who offers me rich beef lasagna, woodfired pizza, or spare ribs, and doubly so if this is followed with crème brulée for dessert.





### **ANY PET HATES?**

I have a high appreciation for that precious but all-too-rare virtue of punctuality, the lack of which often requires me to exhibit that noble fruit of the Spirit known as patience (Gal. 5:22-23), which of course is conducive to my sanctification. My generally calm and temperate disposition is also put to the test when someone drives on the road in an unaccountable manner, which requires me to exhibit a related fruit of the Spirit, namely self-control.

#### WHAT IS YOUR DREAM HOLIDAY DESTINATION?

The Mediterranean, especially the Greek islands. I've been very privileged to go before, and if I had the means or opportunity to do so again, I would have no objections.
