

In Matthew 16, Peter declares Jesus to be "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (v16). Peter sees Jesus in kingly terms – the term Son of God was used to describe God's anointed and forever King (2 Samuel 7) who destroys the enemies of God's people, and in whom God's people find refuge by coming under His rule (Psalm 2). In response, Jesus replied: "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church" (v18)

Jesus isn't making Peter the pope ... but affirming that he (& the disciples) will play a foundational role going forward. Peter knows he's NOT the church's foundation, later describing Jesus as the *chosen* and *precious cornerstone* (1 Pet 2:4). But Peter, along with the others, will serve as the foundation – a foundation of those who confess Jesus as Saviour & Lord, as Christ & King. In anticipating this, Jesus affirms certain truths about the church:

The Church is the POSSESSION of Christ. The Church belongs to Jesus – not to Peter, not to the disciples, and not to the first members. The Church is Christ's ... bought with His blood and built by His Spirit. We have no claim on it as if it belongs to us ... the church belongs to Jesus. And He's free to do with it as He pleases. The good news is, Jesus is pleased to grow His church so His people become more like Him. So, we look to Him to lead us and guide us, even through difficult, emotional, and changing times ... we trust Him to build His church and build it He will!

The Church is the PEOPLE of Christ. The word "church" speaks of an assembly/gathering. It identifies with Israel gathering at Mount Sinai but now God's people gather before Jesus to hear God speak through Him and to respond in worship and the obedience of faith. The defining mark of God's people isn't their political identity but the personal identity of the One before whom they gather – Jesus. Our community identity is not rooted in biology but belief in Jesus! We are bound together not by our ethnicity, education, or economics; not by our preferences or personalities; not by our likes or dislikes – but because we have come to Jesus. In Him we are One!

The Church will PREVAIL with Christ. Not even death will overcome His church. Neither Jesus' I'm pending death – because Jesus is the son of the living God who'll be raised to life. Indeed, His death and resurrection are the basis for the church. Nor our inevitable death because the church will transcend this world as believers from all nations, tribes and tongues gather before Jesus not just in the earthly realm but, more importantly, in the heavenly realm too ... from where they can never be removed. Our great assurance is that we will prevail if we stick with Jesus ... so, don't lose heart and don't be discouraged!

The Church must PROCLAIM our Christ. Jesus entrusts Peter & Co, and later the whole church, with a great responsibility – the keys of the kingdom (v19). Keys lock & unlock, they close & open. Jesus entrusts His people to make entrance to God's kingdom available through their witness, through their proclamation declaring Jesus is the Christ. To be entrusted with these keys is to be entrusted with the gospel and commissioned for gospel witness. Our responsibility is not just to know Christ, but to make Him known ... so others might know Him and enter into eternal glory. Hence, we love God and love people when we proclaim that Jesus is Lord.

Jesus' teaching about the church gives us a sense of belonging and entrusts us with a sense of purpose. May we find our identity and purpose in Christ and be the church that He calls us to be. The next SCC Times will be published at the end of July. **Yours in Him, Luke**


