

As we start this semester, let's remember our theme for 2024: *Loving one another*.

The Apostle John roots Christian experience and action in the wonderful truth that "God is love" (1 John 4:8) ... but what does that mean? To say, "God is love" doesn't mean that He'll give me whatever I want; or that things will always work out for me; or that suffering & sickness will avoid me – which is what we often want it to mean! "To say that God is love is to say that God eternally gives of Himself to others ... His love is His self-giving for the benefit of others" (Wayne Grudem).

God made His love visible by sending His one and only Son (1 John 4:9-10) – Jesus Christ. God's love is to give Himself to bring us to life, by sending His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Jesus' sacrificial death atoned for all the damage and destruction caused by sin. The cross of Christ is God's definitive declaration of His love for us!

Which is a great encouragement – it means God's love doesn't change, it's not fickle, it's not stronger one day than another, it's not dependant on our mood or our circumstances – nothing can change the love He demonstrated for us at the cross. It should bring us great joy when we realise that God gives Himself to us in order to bring us to true life. He doesn't hold anything back from us – He gave us His Son! And it should give us great assurance when we look to the cross and remember that God loves us!

Of course, If God is love and we're in Him, then His love should be visible through us – "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God" (1 John 4:7). When His love shines through us, it's evidence of our regeneration and demonstrates the family likeness. It's worth saying that the love we make visible is not the touchy-feely, warm sentiment that many mistake for love ... it's the same love God makes visible; the sacrificial, self-giving love of the Son. It's to love in such a way that we emulate Jesus and point others to Him ... indeed, to love without Jesus is not love!


God's love demands that we *love one another* ... that we have gospel dominated and gospel saturated relationships – reminding each other what He did for us and treating each other with the grace and mercy with which He treated us! So, let us love one another: giving each other time – sharing our lives despite the busy-ness of life ... telling each other the truth – speaking the Word of Christ to one another ... and giving each other encouragement and support – serving each other in kindness, building the body into maturity. Let's ensure that at SCC we're making visible the truth that our God IS love! May God help us to love each other as He loves us.

Trusting God with relationships

When I arrived in Thailand, I'm not a hundred percent sure what I expected ministry to look like, but I think because it's an open country I expected to see more fruit more quickly. As I poured a lot of time and energy into relationships with various people, I realised that I expected to see certain changes. As you can imagine, I've had to learn a couple of important lessons along the way. God works in His own time and in His own way, I cannot dictate what the fruit of my labours will look like. I've also needed the reminder that it's



not just about seeing others grow, but making sure that in the process of serving, I too am growing to love Jesus more. As much as I've had to learn to trust God with where He has me, I've had to grow in trusting Him with what He's doing while He has me here. I may not know how God can use the seeds planted in the hours spent with people I no longer see, but that's okay because I do know that He is a faithful God and He'll continue to be at work according to His plan.

While there have been relationships over the past year and a half that have been discouraging (from my perspective), there are many others that have been such a joy. One such example is K, the new Thai staff worker who started at The Centre in February. We meet twice a week, once to help her practice English and the other to read the Bible together. K understands ministry and has a heart to see the students come to know Jesus. As we chat through cultural and language differences, a beautiful friendship is growing, and I am so grateful to God. I'm also ashamed of my mopey attitude that often doesn't acknowledge times like these with K for the joy that they are. B is another great en-

couragement. I first met B a year ago through another friend and didn't see her again until K started working at TC (they know each other). It has been lovely to reconnect with her. B also has a heart to see students come to know God through His word. This coming Tuesday, B will be starting a regular Bible study at The Centre with one of her other friends. It will be run in Thai and will be aimed at seekers. This is a wonderful answer to prayer and is also an example of how God is working things out in His way, in His time. I am so excited for this Bible study to be starting but would never have guessed that B would be the one to help run it, or that it would be starting now. Isn't it good that God isn't working according to my expectations!



The next season's taking shape

Future plans have begun taking shape. God provided the finances that were needed to sign up for full-time language study! I'm so grateful for those whom God has used to make this possible, and I praise God for His provision. I have registered with Lana Language School, and started the application for various paperwork that will be needed when I apply for a new Language Visa from South Africa.

I'm excited for this new season and the changes it will bring, but I'm also trying not to jump the gun and get too carried away with the future. There is still plenty to enjoy in this season, even if it is drawing to a close. The next few weeks hold many exciting opportunities with new students who have started coming to The Centre. There is the short-term team and English Camp, I also still have

classes and therefore opportunities for conversations with students I've been teaching. And of course, I am really looking forward to my time at home and the opportunity to catch up with many of you, and to share in person of what God is doing here in Thailand.
