While preparing for this New Year, I came across some questions from www.crossway.org that help push us in the direction of applying God's Word to our daily lives. I have included them below for you to reflect on as you pursue faith and maturity in Jesus, for you and for your family, in the year ahead:

- 1. What's one thing you could do this year to increase your enjoyment of God?
- 2. What's the most humanly impossible thing you will ask God to do this year?
- 3. What's the single most important thing you could do to improve the quality of your family life this year?
- 4. In which spiritual discipline do you most want to make progress this year, and what will you do about it?
- 5. What is the single biggest time-waster in your life, and what will you do about it this year?
- 6. What is the most helpful new way you could strengthen your church?
- 7. For whose salvation will you pray most fervently this year?
- 8. What's the most important way you will, by God's grace, try to make this year different from last year?
- 9. What one thing could you do to improve your prayer life this year?
- 10. What single thing that you plan to do this year will matter most in ten years? In eternity?

Be assured of our prayers and support for you as you grow your love for the Word and, in doing so, grow also your love for God and for His people. Wishing you all the best in Jesus for 2025.

Being back in Chiang Mai

I have so enjoyed settling into my new house and making it feel like home. I'm really grateful for God's provision in where it's situated and that I'm able to host people more comfortably than in my previous place.

Mr SA Grab is still helping me find my way. I needed to renew the registration sticker on my scooter. Since the flooding which happened in Chiang Mai last October, the system for renewing this sticker has changed because the traffic department was affected by the floods. I did not know this and was prepared to set off on my own to tackle the task. A 'random' message one morning led to him going with me. I'm so glad he was there - because of the new system, we ended up going to three different locations to complete all the steps needed to obtain the sticker. At each new destination there were no clear guidelines of what to do, it was the security guards who told us (well Mr SA Grad) where we could complete the next step. Along the way, he also helped me apply for a special sticker that lets you cut through the military base. I'm so grateful that relationships like this have continued.


The Centre


Language Study

Happy that this hopefully means Thai is starting to take up more space in my brain, and sad that Chinese and all it represents is slipping further and further away. But it's also exciting, as that quote about neighbours reminds me. I'm in a new season of ministry, which has brought me back to this city — and language — for specific people and plans that God mapped out in eternity past. And so, I'm motivated to persevere with Thai and getting it to take up more and more space in my brain, because it means being able to engage meaningfully with these new neighbours.
